



Social Issues Impacted by Marriage/Divorce

How much does the average divorce cost taxpayers?



"In summary, it is estimated that, in the state of Utah, divorce and its financial consequences total some \$414 million dollars per year for both individuals and government agencies. An estimated \$300 million is the direct and indirect costs to the state and local government, while the remaining expenditures constitute direct costs to the divorced individuals, their families, and religious and charitable organizations. This averages out to roughly \$30,000 in direct and indirect costs per divorce for the state of Utah and related federal expenditures."

The \$30,000 estimate was calculated using 2001 cost figures. \$30,000 in 2001 dollars is equivalent to \$50,000 in 2022 dollars

\$40,000 in 2022 dollars is a conservative estimate, per Dr. Schramm



The Greatest Obstacles to this Successfully Taking off Nationwide are Likely to be:

- #1 Shortage of organizations ready and able to replicate the CMI model
- #2 Low-quality implementation of the CMI model in other locations
